If you would like to participate but do not have access to a computer please let us know. The survey typically takes 10 to 15 minutes to complete and is completely confidential.

### **SCHOOL OPAL CARDS**

One of the more significant changes created by the recent introduction of the School Opal card is the need for students to tap on and off when they travel to and from school.

Opal data gathered by tapping on and off is used to determine demand for bus services. If students don't tap on and tap off, services may be cancelled due to the lack of recorded patronage.

With this in mind, we ask for your assistance in reminding your child/ren that tapping on and off at the beginning and end of each trip is one of the conditions of using a School Opal card.

Your assistance helps the bus companies to ensure they are able to provide the appropriate level of service to our students.

climate change and pest species have on many of the 1000

threatened species in NSW.

and animals!'
