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STAGE 3 – YEARS 5 & 6 CANBERRA EXCURSION



Students from our school have recently undertaken an education tour of the national capital. Students have been given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$20 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion and has been factored into the required payments.

In Week 2, 115 eager Stage 3 students and their dedicated teachers made the biennial two-day trip to Canberra to support their studies on Australian Democracy. After boarding the coaches at 7:00am, they visited Parliament House, the Museum of Australian Democracy, the Embassy of Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Australian Institute of Sport, Questacon and the Australian War Memorial.

All our students happily engaged with the variety of opportunities that were presented to them. Even when they all thought they were too tired and it was too dark to go to the Australian Institute of Sport, everyone had a fantastic time! They listened attentively, participated enthusiastically and responded respectfully during each visit and activity. We received excellent feedback about their behaviour and manners from all the venues we visited, including from our coach drivers!

Thank you to everyone who was involved in making this such a successful and memorable excursion.
